Clinical practice — main pillars

Face & neck rejuvenation

Modern facelifts are designed to be conservative and tissue-friendly: less skin traction, more work on the deeper muscular plane, and a careful approach to facial volumes.

- Deep Plane Facelift — natural repositioning of tissues; focus on long-lasting neck and jawline definition
- Neck lift — skin tightening and platysma repositioning for a refined cervico-mental angle
- Blepharoplasty — eyelids, dark circles, ptosis, and subtle periorbital rejuvenation

Facial reshaping & harmony

A comprehensive facial analysis may combine surgical and non-surgical techniques to enhance balance, refine contours, and preserve individual identity.

- Rhinoplasty — medical (injectable) or surgical, depending on indication
- Facial feminization and facial attractiveness — surgical or medical techniques to support facial harmony
- Global facial beautification — tailored strategies for proportion and contours



Clinical practice — main pillars (continued)

Lipedema management

Lipedema is a chronic, progressive condition characterized by symmetrical fat deposits on the limbs, often associated with pain, sensitivity to touch, and easy bruising.

- Comprehensive assessment and clear diagnosis pathway
- Surgical management of lipedema (including full-leg lipedema) when indicated
- Individualized follow-up with a focus on function and quality of life

Maxillofacial & reconstructive surgery

A maxillofacial background supports advanced management of facial trauma, jaw surgery, salivary gland conditions, and complex reconstructions.

- Orthognathic surgery (jaw alignment) and facial skeletal procedures
- Salivary gland surgery and selected facial pathologies
- Cancer reconstruction — including microsurgical reconstruction when needed

Aesthetic medicine & skin quality

Aesthetic medicine includes a wide range of techniques. In practice, the most useful and well-validated tools combine injections (hyaluronic acid, botulinum toxin) with energy-based devices and skin-quality treatments.

- Hyaluronic acid fillers — tailored volumes and precise placement
- Botulinum toxin (Botox) — natural motion, not a “frozen” look
- Laser techniques and light-based treatments (including LED-assisted therapy)
- Radiofrequency for skin tightening (face, neck, and selected body areas)
- Regenerative approaches when indicated
